Sargon the Great of Akkad was a great Mesopotamian king.



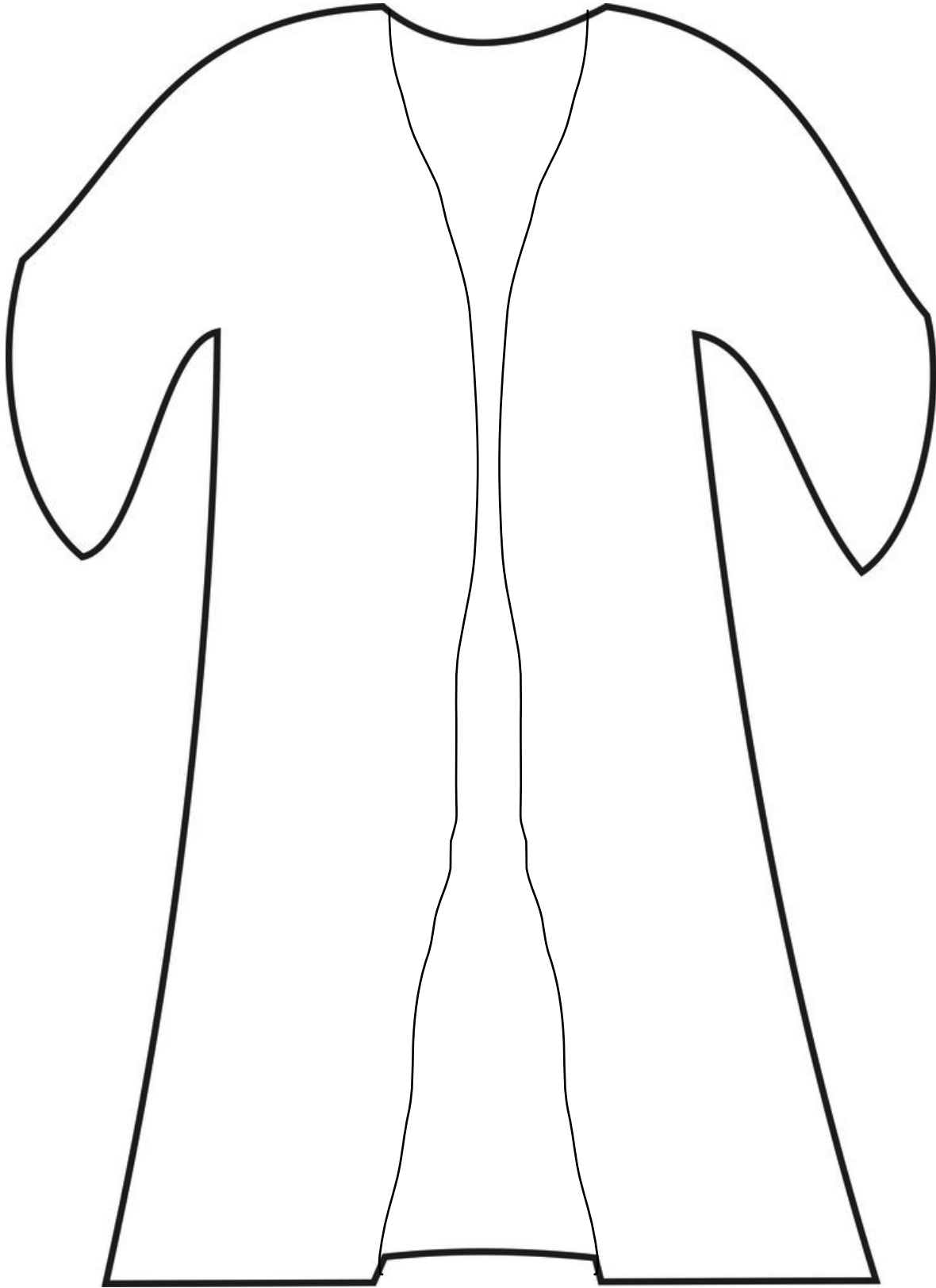

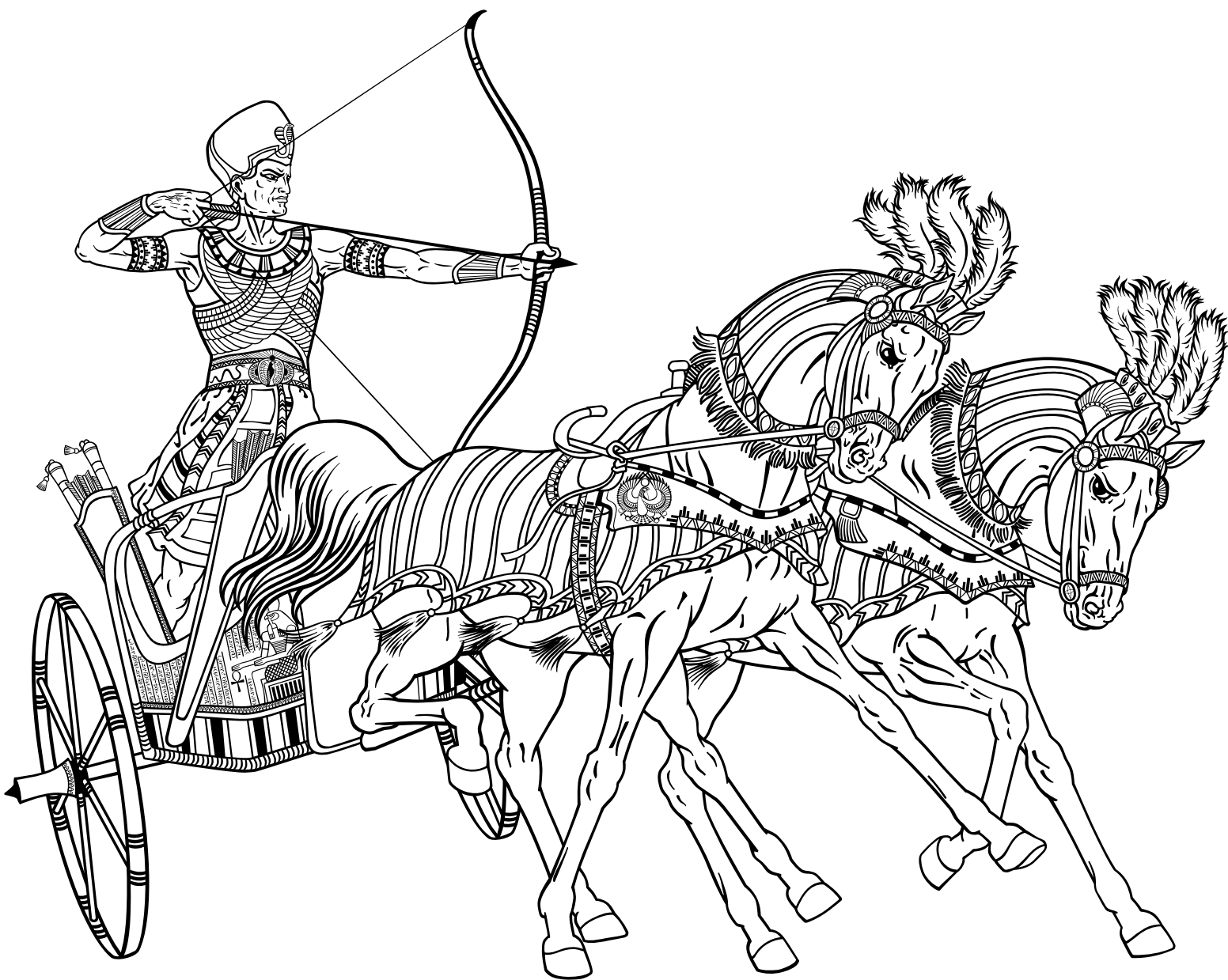
Hammurabi created the first set of laws.

He saved his family from being hungry.



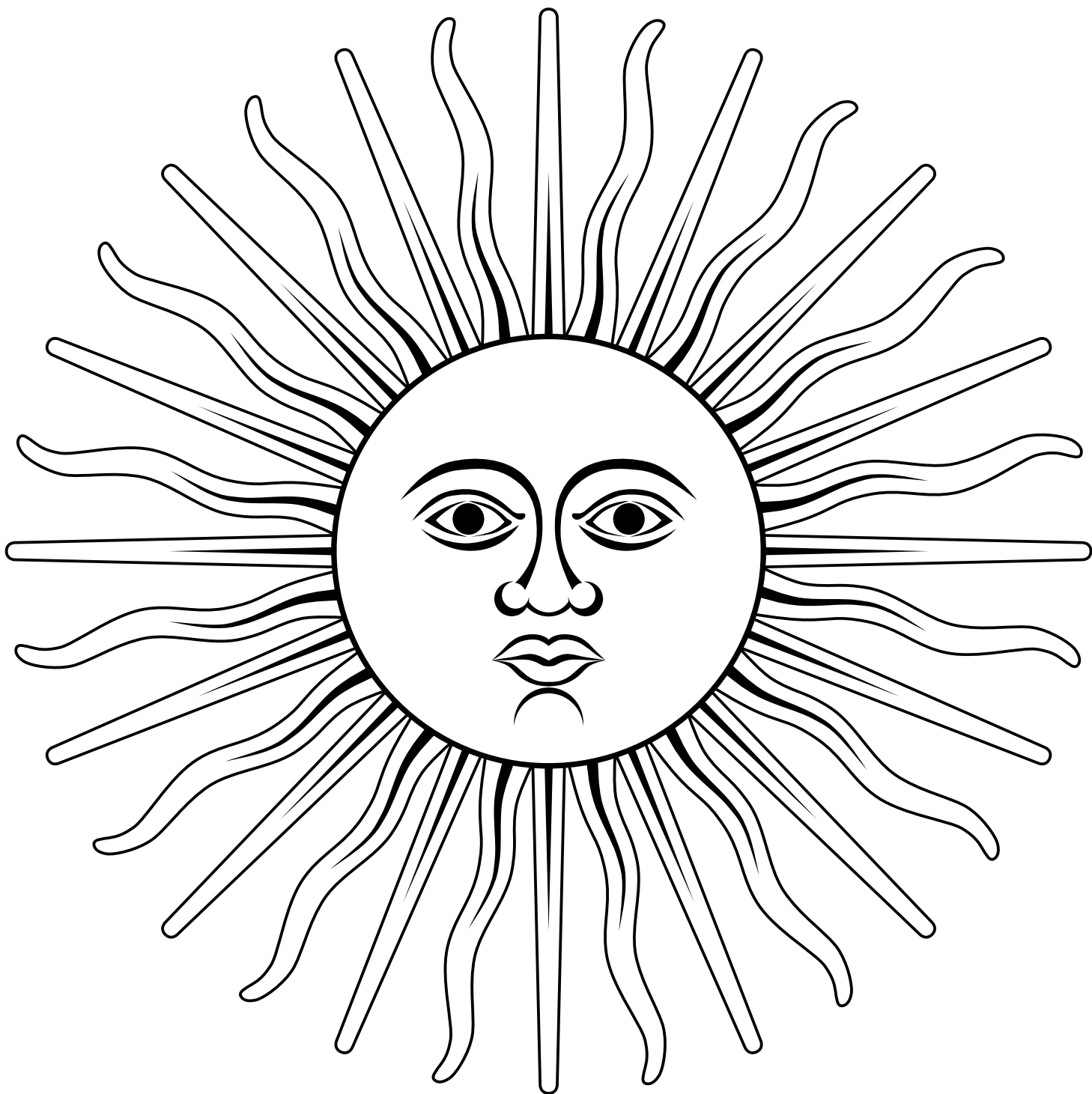
Hatshepsut was a King of Egypt.

He was called a Pharaoh.



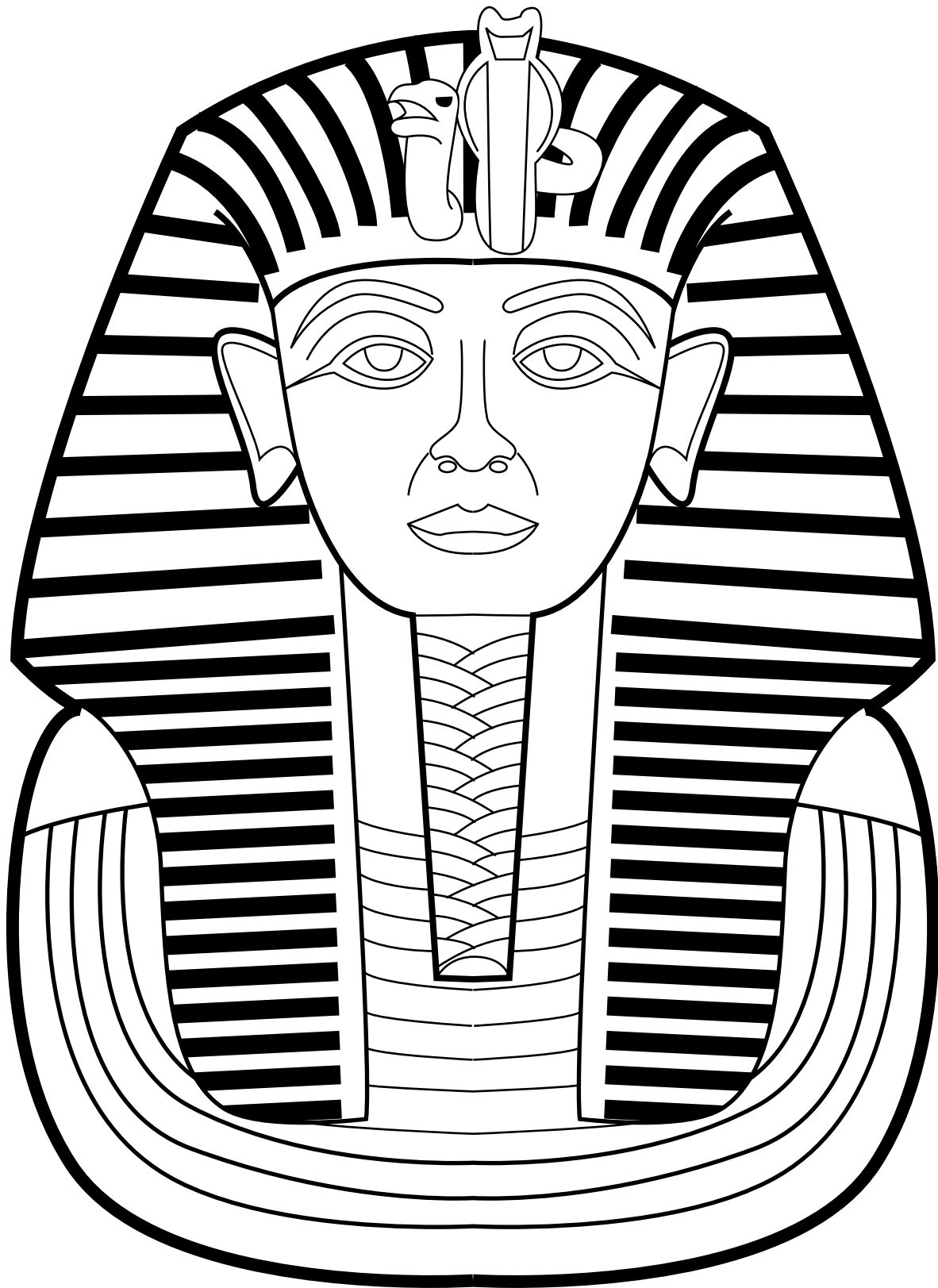
God helped Moses free the Israelites from Egypt

His body is now on display in the Egyptian Museum.



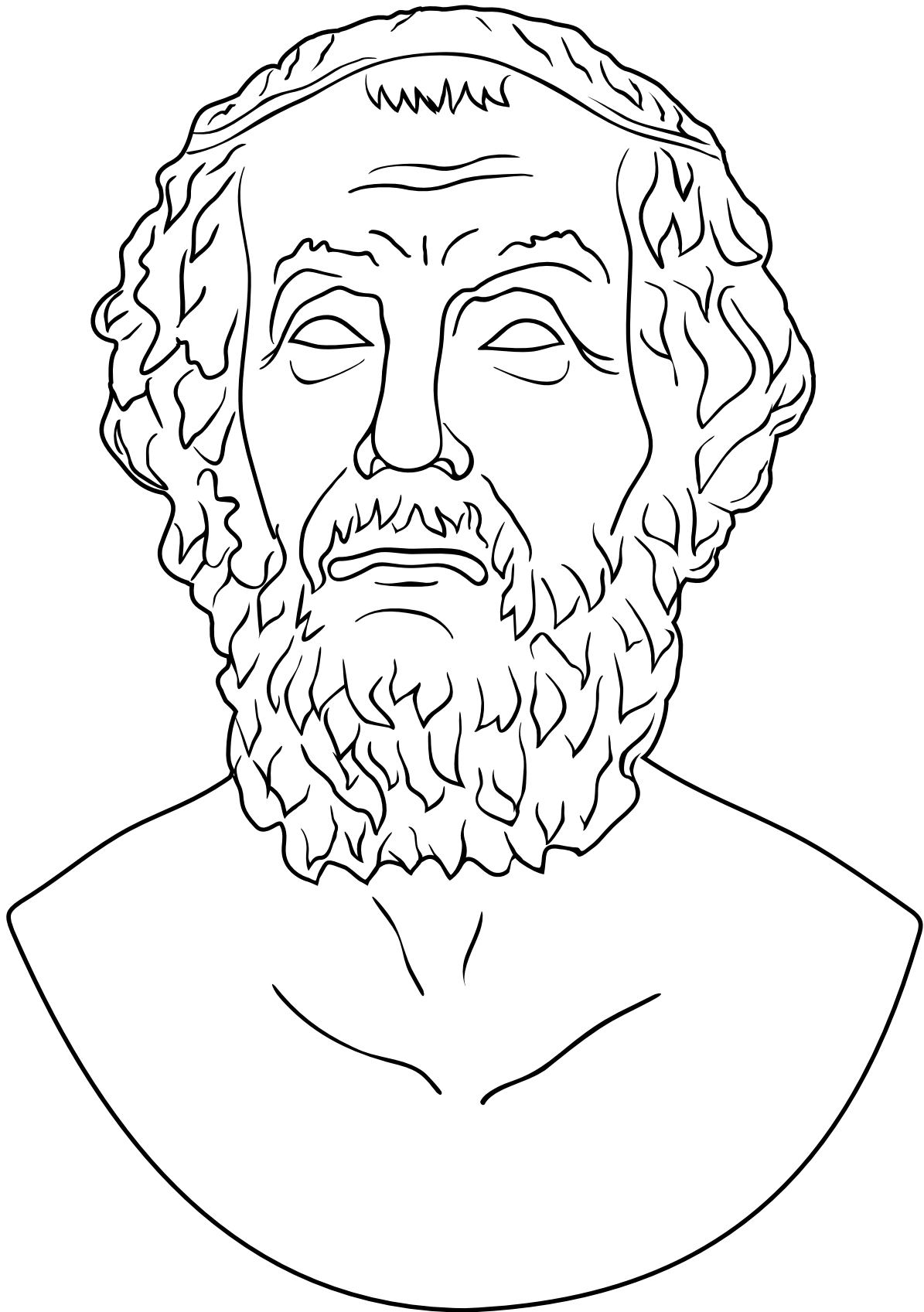
David was King of Israel. God called David a man after His own heart.

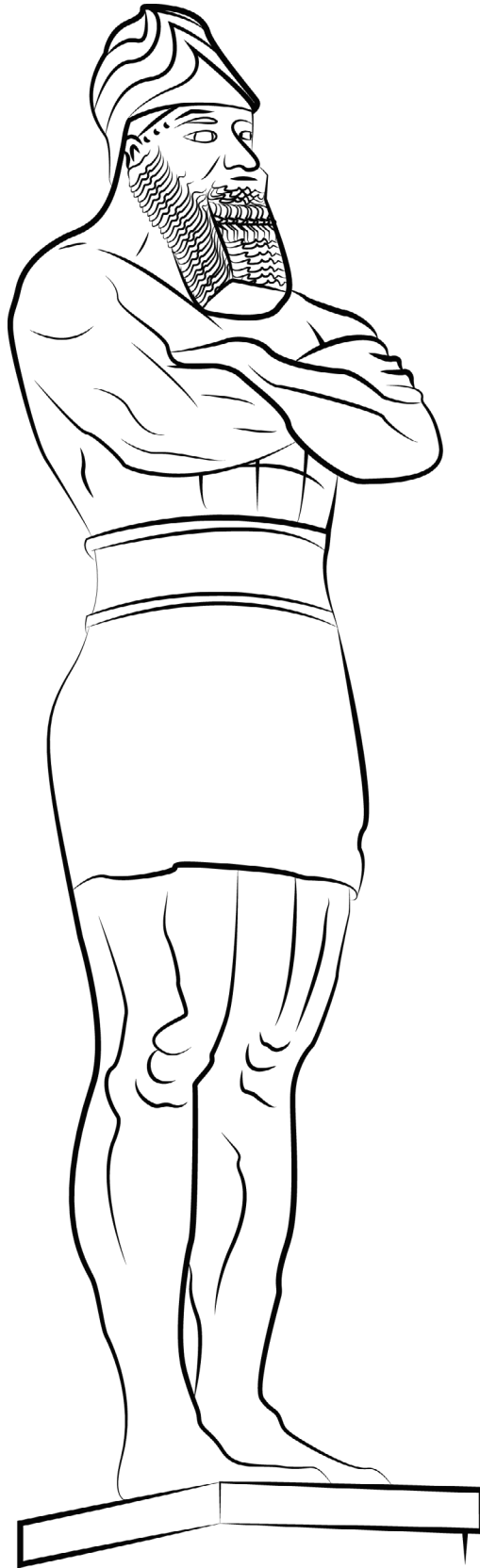

Homer wrote two famous poems about war and the life of a soldier.



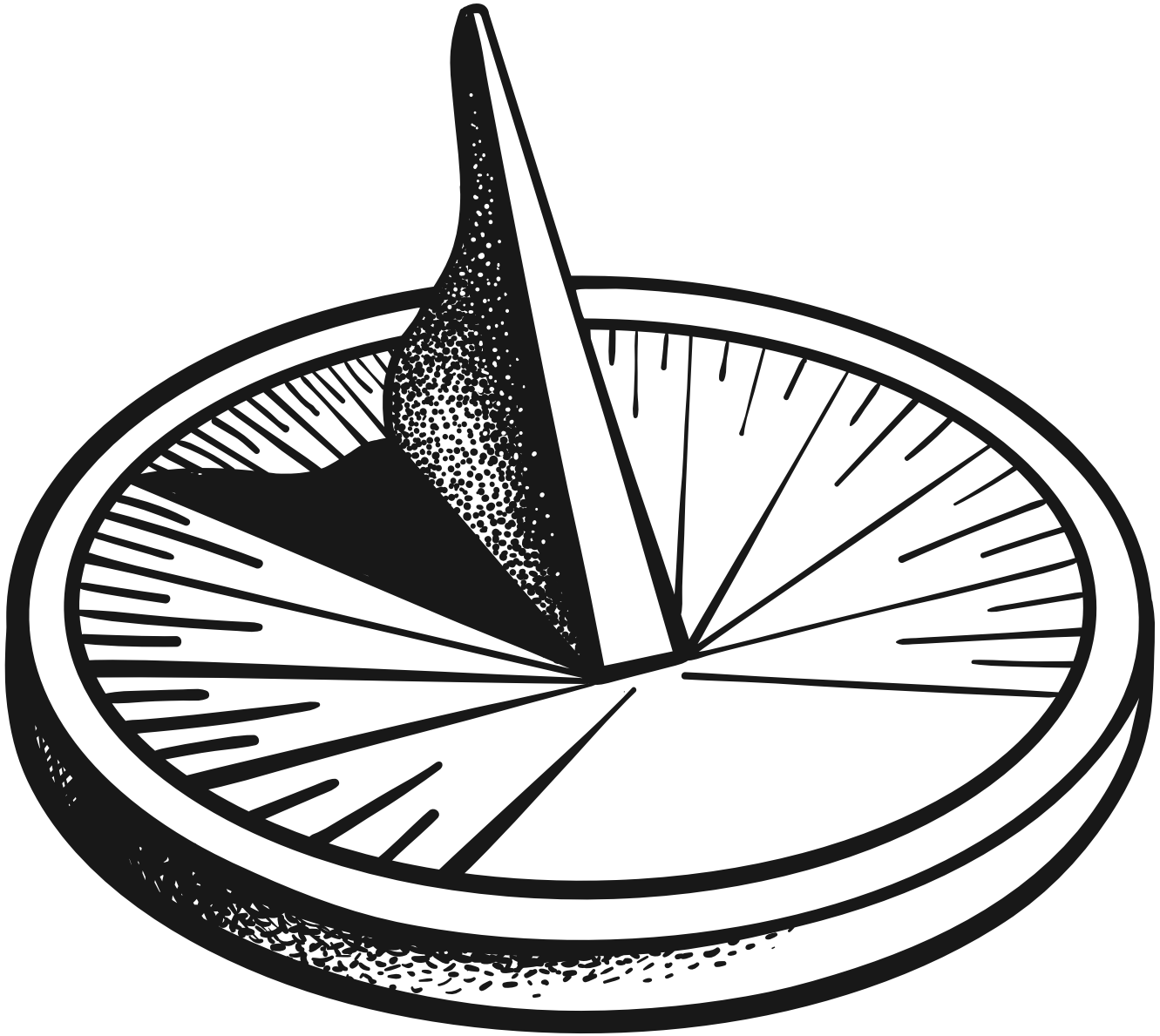
Nebuchadnezzar II was king of Babylon. He created a large statue of himself and wanted everyone to bow down to it.

He made the sundial to be able to tell time.

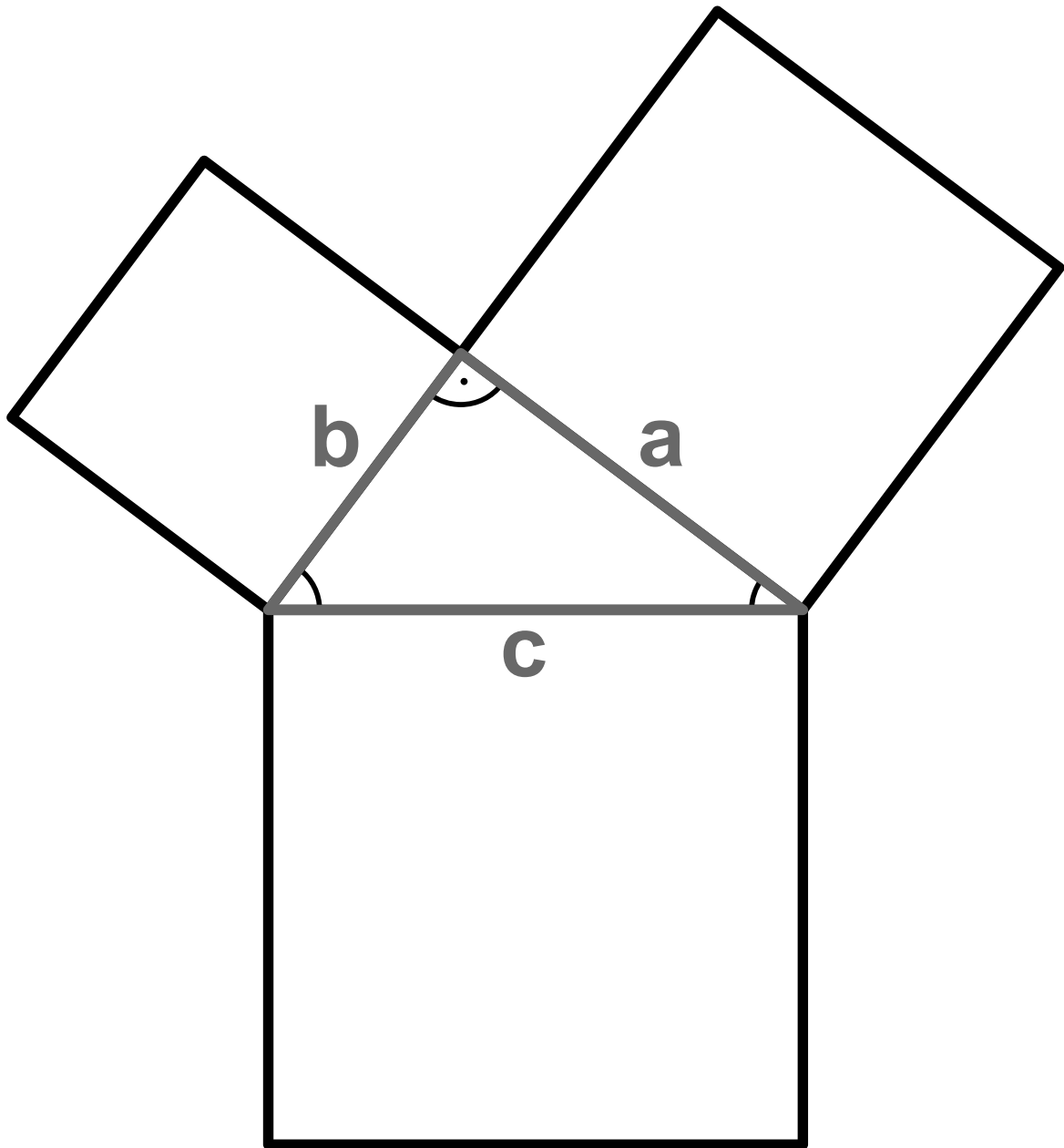


Cyrus the Great was the first Persian king.

Anaximenes of Miletus was a scientist who thought everything was made of air. The Anaximenes crater on the Moon is named in his honor.

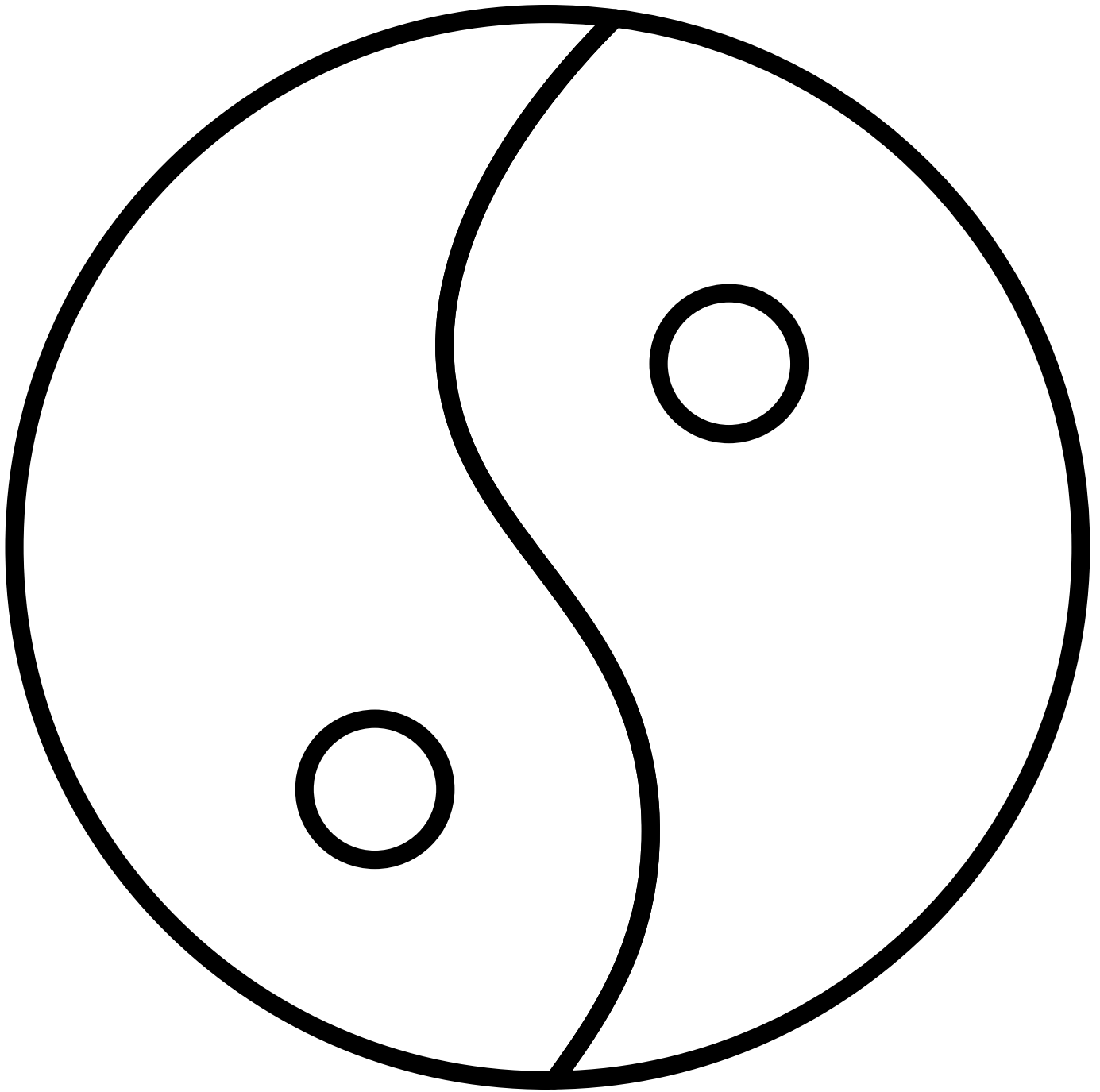

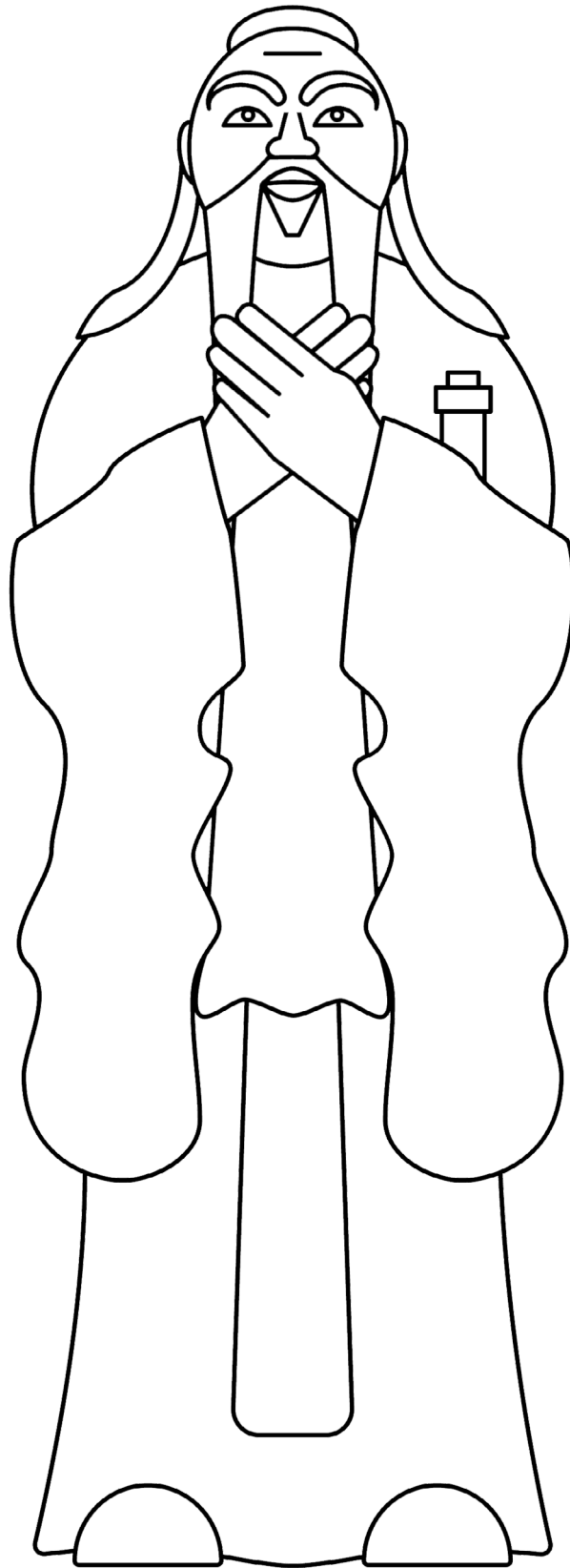
Pythagoras of Samos loved math and astronomy.

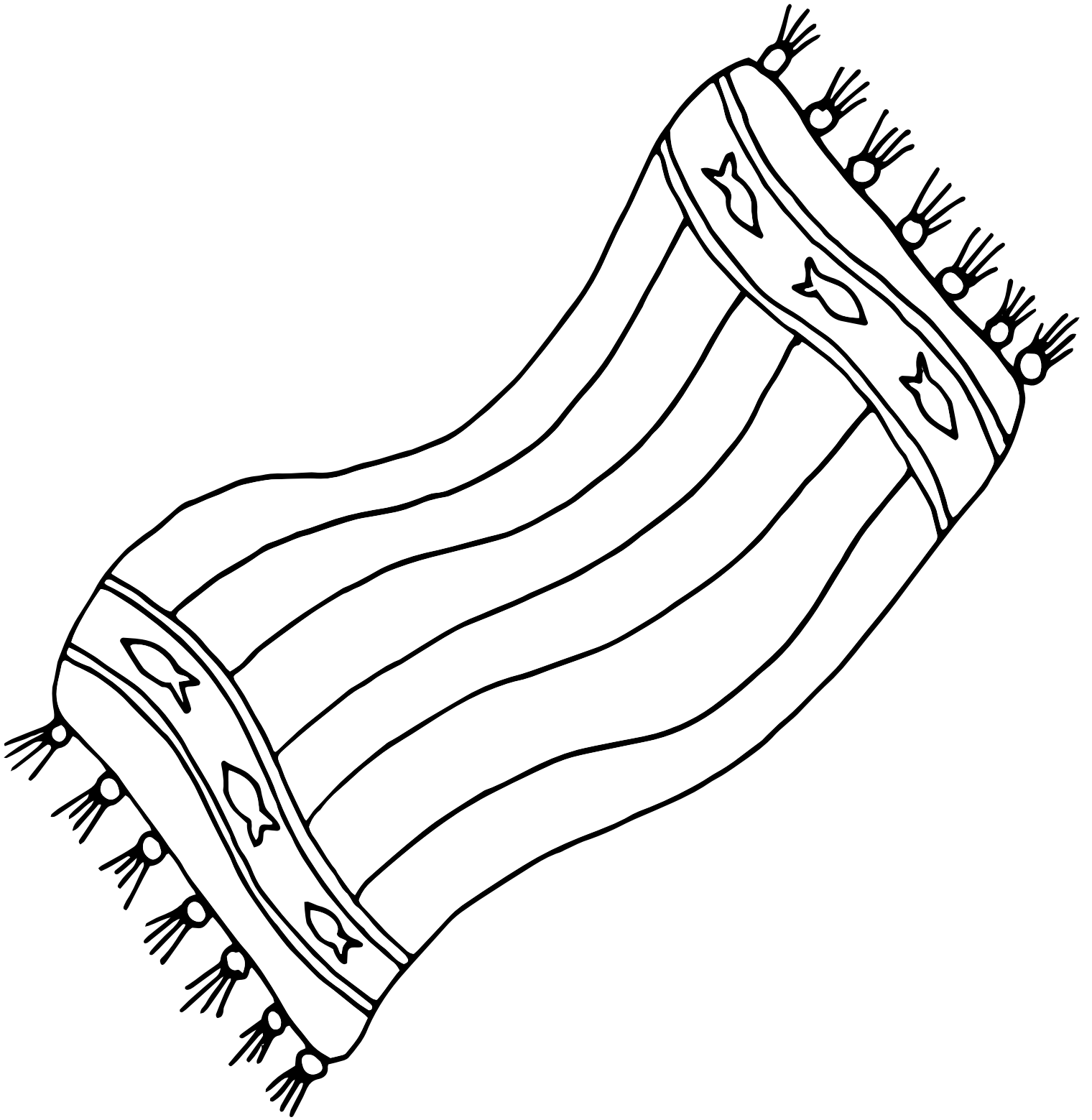

He started a religion called Taoism.



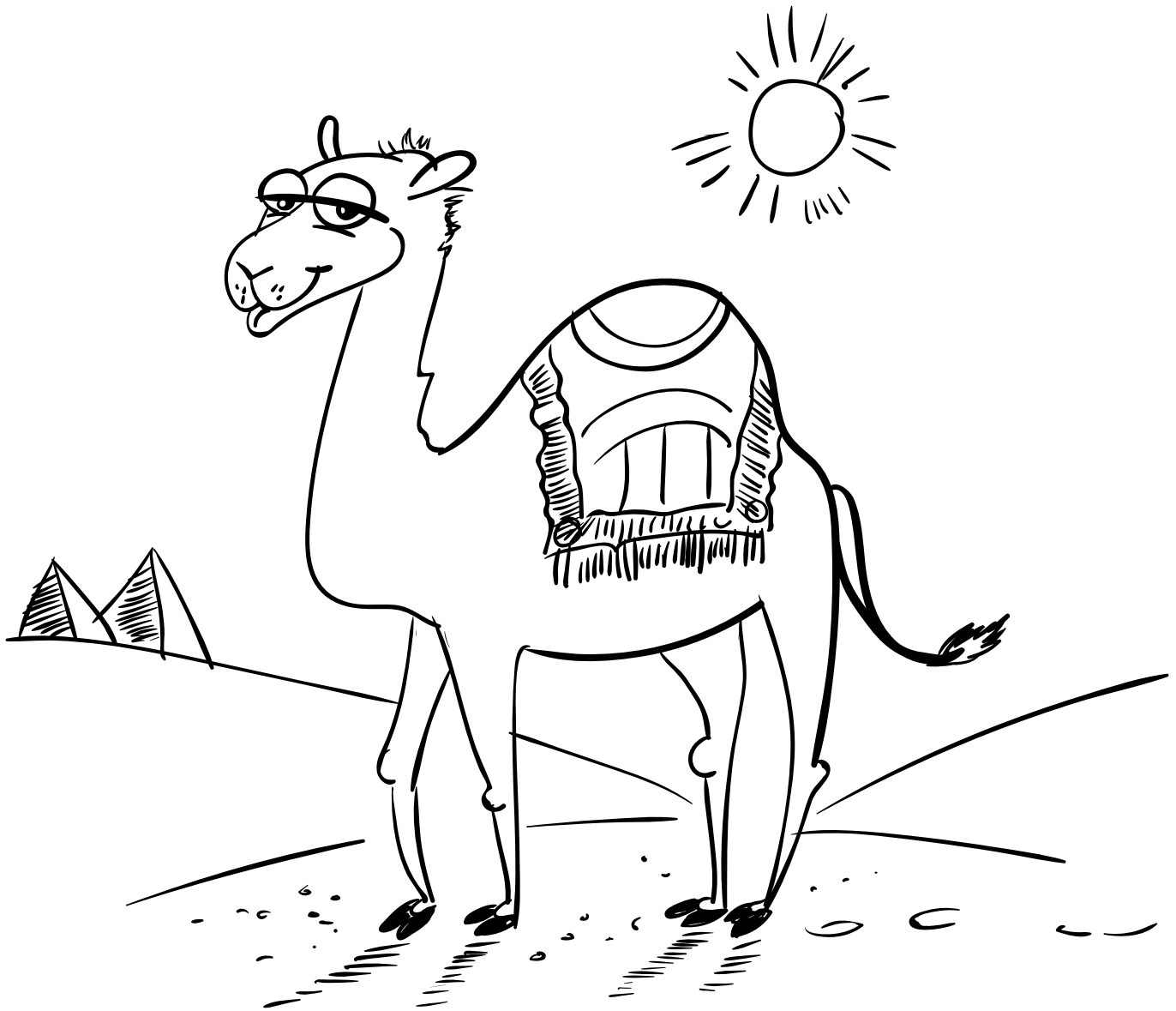
Confucius was a Chinese teacher, editor, politician, and philosopher.
His teaching is known as Confucianism.



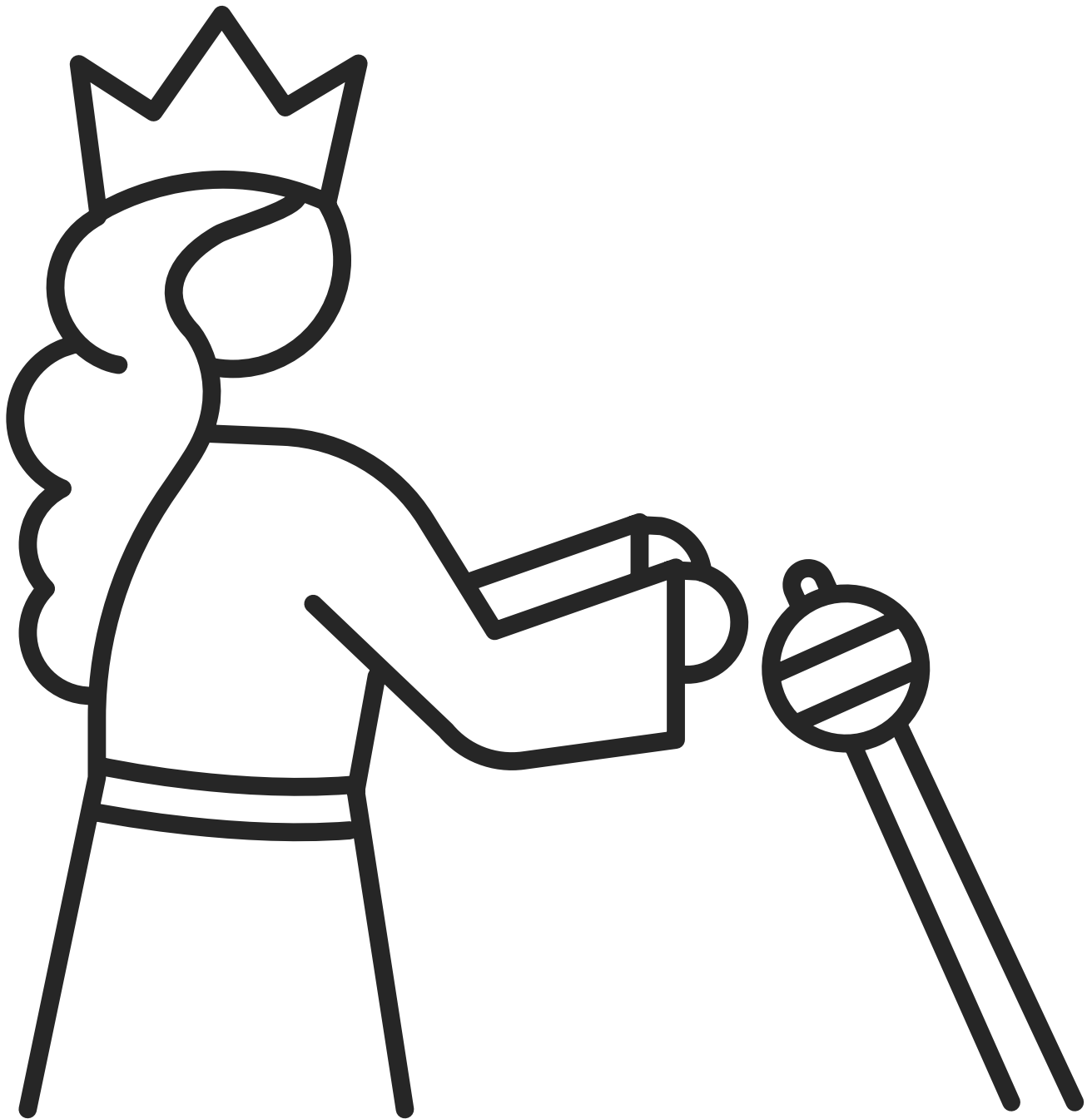
Darius the Great was the fourth king of Persia.
